UCGF CELEBRATES INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S MONTH ACROSS FAIRFIELD COUNTY

The month of March has been very busy for us as the UNESCO Center for Global Friendship, Inc. (UCGF) has been eagerly celebrating the women of our community and beyond. The U.N.'s theme for this year's worldwide celebration is "Think equal, build smart, innovate for change."

Our executive director, Angelucci Manigat, was on WPKN, a non-commercial radio in Bridgeport, discussing the history behind the Women International Day (March 8). The Orange Campus of University of New Haven (CT) hosted on March 13 an event where our



executive secretary, Sabine Januski and Angelucci shared information about the work of UNESCO for gender equality.

On March 8, Sabine was the keynote speaker at a Women's Month Celebration activity at the Ferguson Library South End Branch, in Stamford (CT). She received a standing ovation following her presentation.

The UNESCO Center for Global Friendship, Inc. organized its own Women's Month Celebration through an evening of thought-provoking discussions, poetry reading and live entertainment on Thursday, March 21, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., at the Bridgeport Public Library Main Branch.

That free event featured keynote speaker Reine C. Boyer, who is an attorney with her private practice in Fairfield County, the co-founder of Anacaona Youth Enrichment Program, and an executive board member of The Klein Memorial Auditorium.




Through these events, dozens of people signed up to receive our monthly newsletter, and expressed interest in joining UCGF.

From a month-long book drive, we have collected 8,000 English, Spanish and French books, computers and printers for our literacy programs that support free community and school libraries in Haiti, Jamaica and Nicaragua.

The donations came mostly from residents of Stratford, Trumbull, Fairfield, Bridgeport, Westport, Norwalk and Stamford, in Connecticut. The support of institutions and organizations such as Darien Book Aid, New Haven Reads, Norwalk Public Library, UConn Library Stamford Campus, Haitian American Professionals Association of Connecticut, Inc. and International Alliance for the Advancement of Children, Inc. has greatly contributed to the success of this book drive.

We are now in the second phase of this project, which is to raise \$20,000 to get the collected library materials to their intended destinations by this summer.

We have launched a fundraising campaign

WORLD PRESS FREEDOM DAY CELEBRATION
